# INSTITUTE OF CULTURE AND PORTUGUESE LANGUAGE

The Institute of Culture and Portuguese Language (ICLP) offers a wide variety of courses, catering to the widest possible range of interests and needs of students.

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## ANNUAL COURSE

The Institute offers two regular courses on culture and Portuguese language, running on a semesterly basis, which correspond to the levels described in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFRL). These semesterly courses (with 200 hours each one), allow students to complete two levels per year in two alternative schedules: between 8am and 12pm or between 2pm and 6pm.

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## EVENING COURSE

This course is offered on a semesterly basis and has a workload of 4 hours per week (6-8 pm), for a total of 60 hours per semester, which is the equivalent to a sublevel.

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## SUMMER COURSE

In July, August and September, the ICLP offers summer courses of 80 hours per month which correspond to one EFRL level (from A1 to C2).

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## REGISTRATION

Registration must be made up to 15 days before the start of the Course. No placement is guaranteed after this date.

### Documents required for registration:

- Duly filled application form
- Copy of identification card
- Two passport-type photos
- Payment of the registration fee (50% of the tuition fee)

### Please note:

The student must be at least 17 years of age.

After the registration validation, the Institute may provide students with a registration proof. The Institute is not, however, responsible for issuing student visas or travelling permits.

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## PAYMENT

At the time of registration, the student must pay 50% of the total tuition fee amount, otherwise enrollment will not be fully processed.

The remaining amount must be paid on the 1st week of classes.

Payments made in euro can be made by bank transfer or ATM.

## Rules for Admission and Refunds:

- The placement of students at different levels is done according to a placement test (except for those who have never had contact with the Portuguese language or who have successfully taken CAPLE exams).
  - The decision on the students' language level is the exclusive responsibility of the ICLP Pedagogical Coordination.
  - A minimum of 8 students is required for a course to operate.
  - Students who give up attending a course or want to request a transfer of enrolment to another period, must do so at least 15 days before the beginning of classes. In this case, 50% of the registration fee will be refunded or transferred.
  - If you do not give up attending a course or request a transfer within the aforementioned period, the indicated amount cannot be returned or transferred.
  - Transfers are only allowed when made within the same academic year of the PLE courses (academic year = 3 summer months + two semesters).
